SWIMMING NOTES by Mr. T. A. Davison

The use of the hands when swimming.

The hand position in all swimming strokes is very important, it is similar to the blades of an oar. To use the oar correctly the blade is kept at right angles to the water surface. This is what must be done with the hands when swimming.

- Front Crawl The hand enters the water, fingers first with the elbow held up. The palm faces the water, every effort should be made to maintain this hand position throughout the pull-push movement.
- Back Crawl In this stroke the arm is behind the head with the little finger entering the water first. When the hand is undermeath the surface, the palm should be at right angles once again throughout the pull-push movement.
- Butterfly Both hands enter the water at the same time, fingers first, pointing downwards. Once more, the palms are held at right angles to the surface till they reach the thighs.
- Breaststroke From the arms out stretched position, with the palms flat down (glide position) the hands are turned back to back then bend from the wrists. Keep this position throughout the pull-push movement.

In the first three strokes, namely front crawl, back crawl and butterfly, the arms are the dominant factor and to some swimmers this also applies to breaststroke. Be wise, use your paddles correctly.
