**BRITISH SCHOOL SWIMMING CLUB** - Procession was held on Saturday 17th July and the Club entered a float and won 2nd Prize. Thanks go particularly to Mr. Mount for the decorations on the float and also to the other people who helped to put it all together. Also, to the swimmers who gave up a good part of their day to ride along in the float. A good time was had by all. A letter of thanks has been sent to British Gypsum who kindly loaned the lorry for the occasion.

**ANNUAL GALA.** We are holding our Annual Gala on Saturday 18th September this year and all swimming members will have received an entry form for this event. Will you please return your entry forms as soon as possible. The last date for accepting these entries is 27th August. This Gala is held so that every swimmer can take part and this is the only Gala where you can choose what you wish to enter. All Inter-Club Galas are for the swimmers we choose. All members are expected to take part whatever their speed as this is all part of Club life, so don't let us hear you saying that you are not good enough. Everyone is good enough if you are members of the Club. This gives your teachers a chance to see how you are progressing and gives your parents (who we hope will all come along to watch) a chance to see what you have learnt during the year. It also helps us to choose who will represent the Club in future matches.

We are asking all members to try and sell two books of raffle tickets to help towards the cost of the Gala, which increases every year, and is expected to be in the region of £130 this year. If anyone can sell any more books, we still have plenty left. Tickets for admission to the Gala will be on sale during August.

**BEGINNERS CLASSES.** Welcome to all beginners who joined us at the beginning of this month. Your course of lessons is for six months only so you must all work hard if you want to learn to swim. This means practising as much as possible by going to the pool whenever you can. Some of you will get on quicker than others and if we think you will make a competitive swimmer we shall ask you to stay on for a further six months.

**DISTANCE SWIMMING.** As many of the classes will be half empty during school summer holidays we are fitting in swimming for distance certificates. This will be held between 8.30 and 9.30 p.m. each Friday from 13th August in one half of the Pool and the Training Section will continue as usual in the other half. A list is on the Notice Board for all those interested in swimming distances of  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$  and 1 mile.

**HOLIDAYS.** Although schools 'break up' for summer holidays, we do not and Club sessions are held every Friday during the year (except Good Friday). It would be helpful to let officials on the door know your holiday dates in advance so that a note may be made on the attendance register.

**LOST ARTICLES.** Quite a number of items are handed in to officials each week and are not claimed. May we remind you not to bring items of jewellery, watches etc. with you as neither the Club nor the Pool can be responsible for loss. There is also confusion with Club costumes, several have been taken home by the wrong person lately, so please PUT YOUR NAME IN YOUR COSTUME so that they can be identified. ### 'A' TEAM MATCH AT GREENWICH 5th June 1976

You all put up a very good fight against some very strong opposition. Unfortunately we had rather a large number of disqualifications due to faulty takeovers. Will all members note that your feet must not leave the side of the pool before the other swimmer has touched the side.

This means that three teams had won. To find the overall winner, the total Event points were added up and this gave a final result of :-

As you will see, we were only 5½ points off winning the Trophy and if we had not had a disqualification in the Boys' Squadron of the Match held on 3rd April, we would have won that match outright and won on League Points. So, swimmers, you can see how important it is to make sure the person before you touches when you swim in relays. It can be vital!

I was very pleased with all the swimmers efforts and thank them for turning up so regularly - some of them not missing a single match.

We hope to be competing in the Tudor Trophy 'B' League again next year, so everybody train hard ready for January next year, especially the young members who will be under 10 years of age next year.
