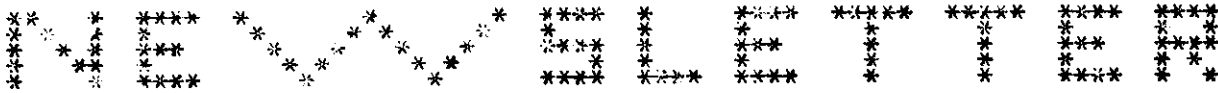

BEGINNERS' COURSES

The present Beginners' Course will end on 25th September. We hope all the children have enjoyed it and will continue to practise their swimming whenever possible. I expect you have noticed Mr. Davison looking at all the children to see how they are getting on? He is looking to see which children he thinks show natural ability according to age and a list will be posted on the Notice Board on the 25th to tell you if your child may join the Club (if you wish them to). It must be pointed out that at least one width must have been swum by the selected children as they will be going into a class where they will not be able to put their feet on the bottom.

We would suggest that any child not accepted for the Club who wishes to further his/her swimming, join the Improvers' Classes held on Wednesday evening by the London Borough of Bexley at Riverside Baths. If after going through the Classes to lengths you feel you would like to join our Club, you can always come along for an audition which comprises one length of breaststroke, backcrawl and frontcrawl.

ANNUAL GALA

Our biggest event of the year, the Annual Gala takes place on Saturday 26th September commencing at 5.30 p.m. The event gives even the youngest members of the Club a chance to compete and show us and their parents how they have progressed.

We have received a good entry which will mean an extra 6 heats and 7 finals compared to 1980. We do hope that all parents, Grandparents, brothers, sisters etc. will give their support and pack the balcony to capacity. Tickets are now on sale at 40p for Adults and 20p for non competing juniors.

We will be holding the Breaststroke Style and Diving events on Friday, 18th September commencing at 8 p.m. and the Individual Medley Heats and Finals will be held on Friday 25th September commencing at 8 p.m. On these evenings there will be no classes after 8 p.m.

SPRING TROPHY

This series, introduced last year is designed to give every Member under the age of sixteen a chance to win a magnificent trophy. This will be presented to the top scoring boy and girl after the completion of this year's races, on Friday 18th December by our President Mr. D.S. Firmin.

The age groups are, Under 10, Under 12, Under 14 and Under 16. All ages as at 31.12.1981. The fastest swimmer in each grouping will receive 5 points, the second 3 points and the third 2 points with all other swimmers scoring 1 point for competing. However all swimmers can score extra bonus points if their time has improved by even a tenth of a second over their previous best time recorded this year. A maximum of 6 bonus points can be scored in this way.

DARTFORD CARNIVAL PROCESSION ON SATURDAY 25th JULY

Within three hours the red white and blue lorry (very patriotic in Royal Wedding week!) had been transformed into the best float the Club has yet created. For this, thanks must go to Mr. Bedford and Mr. James who was responsible for making the superb 'whales' which graced either side of the Club float. There then followed the worrying journey to Central Park, Dartford, where we would pick up our swimmers. Thankfully everything remained intact..... a credit to the float dressers. Our crew of 34 swimmers had practised a limited repertoire of chants and cheers and after a long frustrating delay, the Procession was finally underway.
