OUTING TO THE MUSEUM OF LONDON AND THE R.A.F. MUSEUM, HENDON ON WEDNESDAY, 24th FEBRUARY, 1982

Had this outing been held a week earlier, the prospect of rail travel to London would have been impossible due to the ASLEF train drivers dispute. To my relief a peace settlement was made, and so it was that 32 swimmers, friends and Dads gathered at a fog-bound Belvedere station.

Stepping off the train at London Bridge, we made our way to the Museum of London by foot, viewing some of the numerous points of interest on the way, e.g. Wren's churches, Fire of London Monument, the 'London Stone', Mansion House, St. Paul's Cathedral.

The Museum of London's Exhibition, called London's Flying Start' related the stories of the Citys' pioneer aviators. It proved to be a slight disappointment, although I hope everyone took note of the developments of our own local pioneering aviator, Hiram Maxim, (N.B. a display of his work is presently included in an exhibition at Hall Place, Bexley). Before we left we had a look at the Lord Mayor's Coach which compared with the present Mayor's sleek Rolls-Royce limousine that we had seen earlier.

Lunch was spent in part of the Barbican centre alongside a stretch of the Medieval city wall, and on the site which I later realised was the spot where the first bomb fell on London in the Second World War!

After the inevitable antics on the escalators, we joined the Underground train to Colindale for the R.A.F. Museum. Not content with taking the weight off their feet, many swimmers were soon involved in a "T.V. Superstars" type competition which utilised the train's overhead handrails:

I had intended to give a guided tour of the R.A.F. Museum but due to the boys obvious over-enthusiasm for what was to be seen, curtailed this idea. As it was we only just managed to see everything and had to forfeit a visit to the Souvenir Shop. However much was learnt by everyone, either through impromptu explanations or by answering various Questionnaires.

The day was enjoyed by everyone and we even managed to be back at Belvedere on time again!
