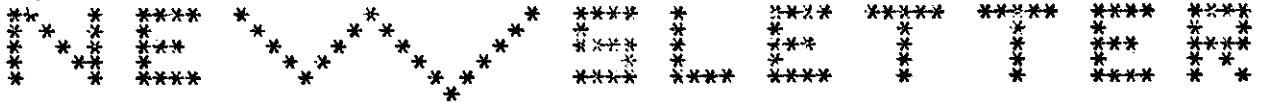

Once we have taught the children all three strokes, we hope to be able to take them through a small test called the ASA 'Water Skills' Grade I, if they pass the test they will be able to buy a badge from us at the price of 30p.
