LONG DISTANCE SWIMMING

Some time in your swimming career you may like to try your hand at open water swimming in lakes or in the sea over distances of several miles.

I have entered eight times an annual swim which is organised in the Isle of Wight and is swum between Sandown and Shanklin piers, a distance of just over two miles. This year there was a record 61 entries.

The swimmers gather at the entrance to Sandown pier about an hour before the start and as the start time draws near they make their way to the end of the pier, threading their way around deck chairs and amusement machines. At the end of the pier they jump into the sea and wait, treading water. At the starting signal all set out for Shanklin.

It soon becomes clear that there are two distinct schools of thought, there are those who think they have a chance of being among the first three ladies or men to finish. The second and by far the larger group aim at finishing the course without being fished out by one of the rescue boats.

Very soon all the swimmers are well strung out, some alone, some in groups of two or three. By the half-way stage I am usually wondering why on earth I got into this mess in the first place and trying to spot a small boat covered with flags, anchored close to the pier and acting as a turning marker. If you have made a good approach you can do a tight turn round the boat with about two hundred yards to go to the finish, but if you have misjudged things you will be well out to sea and could have twice that distance to go, with a tide no longer assisting but trying to take you parallel to the shore.

There is usually a gap of around half an hour between the first and last swimmer coming ashore. There follows a time for refreshments in the club room of the local rowing club with cups and medals presented to the first three ladies and men and certificates for all of the finishers.

Over all a good day's fun - give it a try some time.

### SUMMER HOLIDAY OUTINGS

There were 3 Club Outings during the school summer holidays.

The first was spent in Oxfordshire, up to that time the furthest we had travelled on any outing. With the family and a handful of swimmers we spent a sunny August 8th visiting the Didcot Railway Centre, an impressive collection of Great Western Railway rolling stock in an original depot, followed by some sightseeing in the City of Oxford itself.

Later that month and quite by chance, I saw a poster advertising the Parade of Tall Ships along Southampton Water on Wednesday 25th August. Being Maritime England Year, this once in a lifetime opportunity was too good to miss and so I rapidly organised an Outing. With my son, Matthew and a handful of swimmers we were to travel the furthest distance of any Outing to date. With many of the larger sailing ships 'missing', I personally found the parade a little disappointing, a view shared by the famous yachtswoman Clare Francis, who had been commentator for the event, and whom we were later lucky to meet and interview (!) We rounded off the day with a spot of sightseeing around the historic City, (N.B. Every attempt is made to make Club Outings as cheap as possible. Each swimmer paid just £1.50 for this Outing!).

With many people returning from their holidays and the school year only a week away, more swimmers were available for the Outing to London on Wednesday 1st September. The main attraction of this Outing was the visit to the laboratories in the Medical School of Guy's Hospital and here 17 swimmers and parents spent several absorbing hours with a varied programme of things to see and do. Apart from talks and demonstrations into laboratory safety, the examination of complex scientific equipment, a look at 'pickled' sections of the human anatomy and a tour of the Biochemistry Department (seeing research into Muscular Dystrophy in progress), everyone donned a lab. coat to undertake an actual scientific experiment, 'The Estimation of Creatinine in Urine'. After background explanation and considering no one had used any of the scientific equipment involved before, some very good results were obtained. As a contrast, the remainder of the afternoon was spent in the eerie depths of the 'London Dungeon'. The day should have been rounded off by a riverboat trip to Greenwich, but having missed the last boat and with deteriorating weather, we finally decided to call it a day, but a very enjoyable one at that.

N.B. If you missed these Outings, the next one will be during the Autumn Half Term on Wednesday 27th October. It will be a Ramble of approx 7 miles from Shepherdswell to Sandwich, down in deepest Kent. Details will be appearing on the Club noticeboard in the near future.

As many of the swimmers who were involved in the Outings during the first 6 months of the year were not around when I displayed the respective photos in July, there will be another chance to see them soon, and if you so wish, order copies.
