LONG DISTANCE SWIMMING

Each year the British Long Distance Swimming Association hold a series of eleven Championship Swims at locations as varied as Bala in Wales with a course distance of three miles, Loch Lomond Twanty-three miles, Torbay eight miles.

For the past two years I have participated in one held in Surrey, last year at Thorpe Park and this year at Mercers Park near Redhill on 17th September with a course distance of three miles, it was too good to miss.

The Lake is an old gravel pit that is being turned into a recreation centre, very deep and at the end of the warm weather - a water temperature of no more than 60°F. It has high banks all round which makes it ideal for spectating Mums and Dads and other assorted relations. The weather was dull and windy and it seemed that all the local wasps were making a day of it around the Officials' Tent.

The organisation was very good even to the extent of supplying an ambulance from the local St. John's Service. Half an hour from the start there was a briefing for the swimmers explaining that the course consisted of four laps for seniors and two for juniora around a section of the lake marked out by coloured floats. Then there was just time for those who wanted to to put on some grease or olive oil to keep some of the cold out and after a final roll call it was down into the water and away.

Laps one and two went by without trouble, though its a bit discouraging for the tail enders to be lapped by the leaders after one circuit and by the start of their third circuit the leaders were climbing out having completed the course in around one hour.

By the end of the third lap the cold was getting in and the atroke was getting a bit ragged and it was a great feeling to negotiate the small island for the last time and get the finish in sight, even better to climb out of the water, into some clothes and make use of the hot tea provided by the Officials. The winner was Stephen Dockery of Warrington Dolphins L.D.S.C.

There had been around fifty starters from all over the country. A few of whom had retired. Certificates were awarded to all finishers.

The youngest swimmers were junior entrants of twelve and thirteen and the oldest was someone who should have know better from the Erith and District Swimming Club.

SPARE A THOUGHT FOR THE MORE SENIOR SWIMMER

How times have changed since I first became a spectator at the Clut? That was 11 years ago in 1972 when my daughter - still an occasional swimmer - was 9. In those days the Club was only allocated swimming time on a Friday night and for a good number of years each swimmer only trained for half an hour a week. There was no 'Under 10' age group and young swimmers had to swim in the 'Under 12' age group. My son joined the Club 3 years later in 1975 and in those days you went from a widths class to a three-quarter length class before joining the length class - still only half-an-hour a week.

Galas were as exciting in those days for both swimmers and parents as they are now, but not in quite the same way. We didn't win many galas or even come second many times because our children didn't train as often as other Clubs but the satisfaction of seeing them better their own time was wonderful.

It was really good news when we were allocated Tuesday nights for training in November, 1977; still half an hour sessions though, but how the swimming times started improving? We also began to do better at galas.

As you all know the young swimmers at the Club today get at least one hour of training a week, rapidly increasing to two hours as they progress. Hence they are doing well in galas, whilst the older swimmers, through lack of training in earlier years, find the opposition very tough - often standing on the blocks against County swimmers and other competitors with frightening times due to longer training periods during their years of swimming. It still pleases them when they come in third or fourth with a personal best time. So folks, please spare a thought for the small group of older swimmers who have maintained an interest in the Club and given it their support and loyalty for many years. Without this group there would be no galas with Under 16 and Open age groups!
