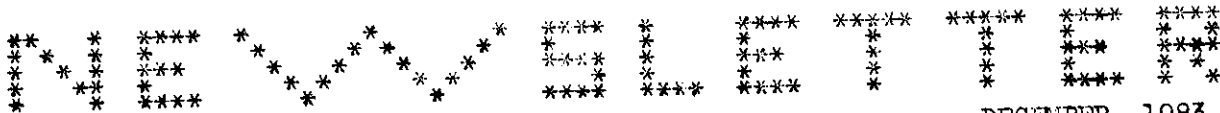

Friday 16th December Christmas Raffle Draw and Cartoon Caption Competition prizegiving will take place following the award of the Sprint Trophies.

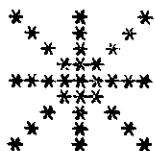
Dates and details of 1984 Club Outings will appear in the New Year. Keep your eyes on the Club Notice Board.
