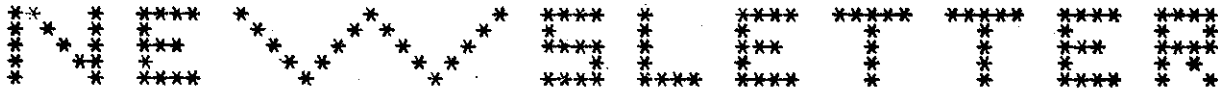

SECRETARY'S NOTES

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

CLOSURE OF RIVERSIDE POOL

As some of you are already aware the Council have over the past 2 years updated the Plant Room equipment at Crook Log and are at present tackling Lamorbey in a similar way by installing modern and more economical boiler equipment.

This obviously necessitates the closure of the Pool whilst this is taking place and we have now been officially told that our Pool will close for approximately four months on 31st January 1986. During this time, apart from the installation of the new boilers, (the present ones incidentally are steam boilers run on heavy oil and were transferred from the original open pool across the road when Riverside was built.) The troublesome tiles on the Pool will be dealt with and we have also been assured that a proper tiled area with drainage will be incorporated on the balcony to replace the present very unsatisfactory situation which has caused us great concern.

Obviously this major upheaval will have a serious effect on our Club and following a meeting with the Pool Management we have been granted 2½ hours on Thursday nights at Crook Log. The Council were unable to find any time for us on our 'traditional' Club nights: We ask everyone to be patient and bear with us during this difficult time and full details of the new arrangement will be announced nearer the date.

In the meantime we are seeking other Pool time elsewhere on a temporary basis but our chances are not too bright as so many other Clubs are doing the same thing. However, our time on Wednesday evening at Dartford College will continue from 6 - 7.30 and I trust more of you will make use of this facility in the New Year, and the classes will be re-arranged to accomodate more of you as necessary.

We are also considering the offer of an hour's training time on Saturday and/or Sunday mornings (7-8 a.m.) at Crook Log, so with your total co-operation we will be able to continue as normally as possible if somewhat fragmented.

We have been assured that we can return to our present arrangements on Tuesday and Friday evenings once the Pool has re-opened, with a review later in the summer regarding our 'lost' Tuesday hour with the possibility of this being granted again for the winter months.

All of you will be kept in touch with these arrangements once confirmed.

'THE COMPETITIVE SPIRIT'

Over the last two weekends we have competed in Galas against some very strong local Clubs and on both occasions have finished well behind. Some of you may write us off and consider our performance as second rate, but before doing so you should first consider the following points.

Firstly, many new Personal Bests were achieved and most of you competed extremely well. With Sunday Training the maximum water time available to our top squad is three hours. Most of the swimmers in these recent competitions are training at least twice as much, both early mornings and as far away as Crystal Palace Pool to gain the 'edge'.

Our Club has never wished to spend every day of the week at a swimming pool, and whereas these other swimmers pay for the services of a Club Coach, none of our Officials receive any payment although some spend the remaining evenings when they are not at the Pool on Club administration, etc.

Despite the fact that our Coach Bill Lovett, together with Pam Bedford and some of our newly qualified Prelim Teachers spend every Sunday at Riverside between 12.00 and 1.45 for the benefit of the swimmers, only an average of one-fifth of the total membership bother to turn up. Therefore those of you who do train this extra hour are, in many cases, beginning to 'gain the edge' and this was certainly noticeable at the recent Annual Gala.

Whilst we are still 'in dispute' with the Borough of Bexley over our lost Tuesday hour, it has become patently obvious over the past year that London Borough of Bexley have a very commercial outlook on swimming pools and as a result the Clubs using the Borough's Pools have suffered either lost time or lost facilities. Compare this with the situation in neighbouring Greenwich where the three Swimming Clubs do not pay for Pool hire, whilst we now pay £14.50p per hour, and the situation at Dartford where the Club is blessed with a very enlightened "attitude".

It must also be remembered that although these other Clubs have good 'depth' at most age levels, our Club presently has only one in both boys and girls where this situation exists, namely the 1973/4 group. In some of the teenage age groups we are constantly short of swimmers, whilst in the younger groups we do not at present have a sufficient number of experienced swimmers when coming against formidable opposition. Also with accepting Gala invitations it is not always known who will also be competing against us.

However the 'unique blend' we are able to offer at modest cost is something you won't find locally, if indeed, anywhere else!

VERRUCA

When attending the Club please wear a verruca sock until completely clear. Put it on before getting to the Pool if possible and only take it off again when you have put a towel on the floor for the affected foot. This will help to prevent your Club-mate getting one through your negligence.

A few years ago we prevented members from attending the Club when they had a verruca, whilst we do not want to return to this situation, we trust you will take all the suggested precautions to ensure that such actions and further reminders will be unnecessary.

CLUB RECORDS

TIMEKEEPING

On many occasions swimmers when finishing a race will ask the Timekeeper for their time, This is a practice that can lead to upsets, disappointments and arguments. As the time taken by the Timekeeper is only the accepted time, which is unofficial and can be subject to alteration by the Referee and Chief Timekeeper.

The finishing positions for all races are determined by the Place Judges and Referee, who look for the actual touch in each lane, and not by the time taken for that race. An example of how times can be altered before they are made official is given below:-

PLACE JUDGES/REFEREES

Thus if you were swimming in lanes 2 or 5 you would be rather upset and disappointed when your official time went up onto the board, after you had been told by the Timekeeper the time on the watch. Please bear in mind when you ask a Timekeeper for your time and they refuse, its not that they are being awkward, they are trying to stop the disappointment, embarrassment and/or arguments should your times need to be altered.

Timekeepers are human, each with a slightly different reaction time, different times can be taken for the same swimmer by independent Timekeepers on the same lane, whose reaction to the Starters gun/whistle may well be different, as could their reaction time to the touch at the finish.

TIMEKEEPING (Continued)

Where two Timekeepers are assigned to each lane the slowest time taken is the accepted time. Where three Timekeepers are assigned to a lane and all the times taken differ the middle time will be the accepted time. Where three Timekeepers are assigned to a lane and two of the three times taken are the same, that time will be the accepted time. But as previously stated accepted are not official times also should there be any need for a disqualification (which a Timekeeper would not know of) no time will be recorded.

So please do not ask for your times at the end of the race, wait for them to be put on the notice board, then you will know they are official.
