SPRINT TROPHY

The experiment to swim two strokes on one evening, thus lessening disruption of normal classes on the customary four evenings, was deemed a success. I was encouraged by the number of new youngsters competing for the first time but disappointed by the absence of some well known faces and the attitude of some who, despite both announcements and a notice displayed for some weeks previously, had other more pressing engagements. All teachers and officials of the Club give their time up freely throughout the year and do expect in return to see the swimmers compete in all Club competitions. So please make sure you swim on Friday, 12th December in the breaststroke and butterfly events. We need your support to assist the Competition Secretaries in their Gala selections for 1987. The prizewinners' presentations will take place on Friday, 19th December at 8.00 p.m. This will be followed by some 'organised' fun events and team races for all age groups.

B.S.C.A. AWARDS

For the benefit of newer members, this series of awards provides a super incentive to improve your personal best times progressively, firstly to the bronze standard and, as you improve, on to the silver and gold standards.

The basic oval badge for the three levels costs just 65p and the flashes for the various strokes in which you qualify are 20p. So if you swim a qualifying time in any event at Riverside or any other pool in a gala, you can obtain a badge, (relay times are only provisional). All standard and strokes badges/flashes along with official Club record cards (record your P.B's the professional way!) are available on Friday evenings from the ladies on the door.

A list of qualifying times with relevant pool lengths is permanently displayed on the Club notice board. So go for those badges!

EXPLANATION OF AGE GROUPING

Again, this is for the benefit of newer members. With a new year fast approaching, please remember that in the majority of swimming events you are likely to compete in during your time with the Club, we base age groups on the age you will be as at 31st December of the current year.
