## SECRETARY'S NOTES

### Club Fees

For the benefit of our newer members and beginners parents, please note that all Club instructors and helpers give their services on an entirely voluntary basis and receive no fee for the work they put in at all levels for the Club throughout the year.

The Club does not receive any subsidy from the Council towards its finances and pays the standard rate for pool hire costs, (these are shortly to increase again to £18 per hour, a rise of £1.50 per hour, with Saturday evening galas increasing to £50 per hour). The modest Club fees we charge pay for the pool hire and all other running costs as you will no doubt see from the Club balance sheet to be presented at the forthcoming A.G.M. Despite this, unless further unforeseen increases are charged to us this year, you will be pleased to learn that we will be holding fees at 1987 rates for the next 12 months.

A reminder that on 1st April, these annual subscription fees for 1988/9 fall due. Whether you choose to pay one sum or in two half-yearly portions, we would obviously appreciate an early settlement. (Please bring your membership card with you when renewing).

### Annual General Meeting

All members should have already received notification of our Annual General Meeting which this year is to be held on Sunday, 6th March in the pool clubroom. The annual Club accounts will be presented on that afternoon together with a review of the previous year and our proposals concerning fees, rules, officials etc. applicable as from the 1st April 1988. If there is any matter you would like to ask questions about concerning any aspect of Club life, then this is your opportunity.

### Dartford College Easter Arrangements

There will be no Wednesday sessions on 6/4/88 or 13/4/88. Sessions will remain as normal until the 30th March and will resume after Easter on 20th April to continue until the summer break.
