## SECRETARY'S NOTES

### ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION FEES 1989-90

I write to remind you that Club Annual Subscription Fees fall due for payment on the 1st April and regretablely, they must be increased. We last revised our fees in October 1986 and have been able to absorb two increases in pool hire during that time. With a further increase in pool hire of £1.00 per hour due, also from the 1st April, from that date it will cost the Club £19.00 per hour for training sessions and £53.00 per hour for Gala hire. The additional training session on Monday evenings has also placed an additional strain on our resources.

Consequently, from the 1st April 1989, Annual Subscription Fees will be as follows:

Annual Subscription Fee, if paid in full - £30.00

OR, if paid in two 6 monthly instalments - £15.50 each.

From the same date, the swimming session fee will be increased to 25p each. Similarly, all spectators fees will be increased to 10p.

Despite these increases, for a maximum outlay of £1.60 per week, the Club is able to offer most members four hours of water time - so, get the most out of your Club!

The E.D.S.C. Annual General Meeting will be held at 2.00p.m. on Sunday, 5th March in the Clubroom at Riverside following the lunchtime training session.

All members should have already received notification of this meeting together with balance sheets for the Club and Social Section which give a breakdown on our finances in 1988.

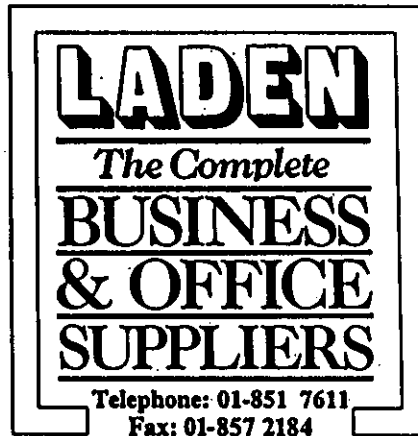
