Endeavour Cup <i>for consistent effort across the year</i>	Amy Butterworth – <i>7 league appearances this year including defending our Octopus League title, Amy swim's with a lot of heart off the back of a lot of hard work in training, supported by a high attendance. She was amply rewarded this year with 12 personal best times at the Club Championships.</i>
Personality of the Year <i>putting the life and soul in to training and competition whilst still setting the right example</i>	Jade Hughes – <i>An all rounder and made 10 League appearances this year in both relays and individuals across all strokes and she manages to inject fun in to any situation; whether it's singing to Sinitta or dragging me on a really scary big wheel she always puts a smile on everyone's face whilst working hard, coming agonisingly close to her first Kent time this year. She was part of the Scottish National Bronze medal Synchro team, achieved 7 pb's at Club Champs, came home from Germany with 4 medals including a Silver (and a few boys phone numbers). I call her a walking talking Heat magazine because if you ever wanna know whose Hot on poolside you've only to ask. She puts the J in JAM.</i>
Swimmer of the Year <i>for Outstanding Achievement</i>	Ruby Verge – <i>Age Group Champion, 12 top 3 League finishes this year with 2 wins and 13 pb's, 3 Kent qualifying times, and moving from 1.26 in January to 1.13 by December in her 100m BK showing her true National potential. A Gold Medallist in her début German tour.</i> Alex Song – <i>Age Group Champion, 15 top 3 League finishes with 4 wins and 9 pb's including a race victory in each of our top 3 leagues of competition. 4 times a Kent medallist including a Bronze and 7 out of 7 pb's this year he returns with 12 qualifying times taking over a minute off his 1500m FREE time between November and January! He has had 100% attendance the whole year and was our only Age Group London Region representative in 6 events making the final of the 200m FLY.</i>
