SECRETARY'S NOTES

AGE GROUPS

For the benefit of our newer members and parents, an explanation is needed to show how age groups work in the swimming world. Our club uses the most common 2 year grouping, always based on the age a child has reached by 31st December each year.

Let us consider good and bad examples:

Child 'A' born 31.12.82 would swim from 1.1.93 as a 12 and under until 31.12.94.

Child 'B' born 1.1.83 would swim from 1.1.92 as 10 and under until 31.12.93.

Some clubs hold competitions based on the age at date of gala, whilst others stipulate under U10/U12 etc. for example 9 years or 11 years of age attained during the year of competition up to 31st December. I hope this helps you to understand the system.
