B. S. C. A. Sprint Awards

These incentive speed award badges are a popular way to aim for improvement in your times. All younger swimmers should first achieve the Bronze Times in all strokes, progressing on to the Silver and Gold Times as the years pass.

All times are recorded both in club competitions and individual swims at galas, and you can compare your times with the qualifying times that are displayed on the notice board at all times.

The Oval Badges cost 95p and the flashes for each stroke cost 35p and are always available from the 'Ladies on the door'.

BLACK LION GILLINGHAM - 20.2.93

We had quite a few swimmers at the above meet and once again all swam magnificently. The swimmers were Trevor Jones, Ian Magness, Katie Attridge, Paul Nicholls, Lyndsay Smith, Andrew Bates, Matthew Walker, Gemma Ford, Emma Lawrence, Rebecca Russell and Glen Scarley.

Paul Nicholls gained our first points for us in the Championship by coming 2nd in Kent in the 100m Breaststroke in a P.B. time of 1.22.42 and a new club record. (lets hope that the County call on him to swim for them). Paul then continued in the evening by coming 5th in the 100m Fly. Rebecca Russell made 1st reserve in the 17/18 years 100m Breaststroke, and Trevor Jones narrowly missed 2nd Reserve by just 1/100th of a second.

SEVENOAKS 27.2.93

This was the last 2 gala's in this series of 8, and as usual each one of our swimmers swam magnificently (but we could still do even better if we could master the turns better). Andrew Bates came 6th in the 10/11 years 100m Backstroke with a time of 1.23.72. Trevor Jones knocked nearly 3 seconds of his time and recorded a P.B. time of 1.03.63 in the 14 years 100m Freestyle. Ian Magness came 4th in the 100m Freestyle with a P.B. time of 1.00.13 (watch out all you older swimmers) and he came 6th in the 100m Backstroke in a P.B. time of 1.12.20. Joanne Mays made 1st reserve in the 16 years 100m Breaststroke and Rebecca Russell made 2nd Reserve in the 17/18 year old 100m Backstroke. Philip Rush and Kris Carpenter were first time swimmers to these events, lets hope that they swim next year for us. Also swimming were Matthew Walker, Glen Scarley and Paul Nicholls. (Note in the finals of the Mens Open 1x2 I/M a swimmer was disqualified for a one handed touch on Breaststroke. it happens to the best). I look forward to next year, and hope that we have even more entries.

RAMBLE IN NORTH KENT 18.2.93

A dull, cold February day welcomed our mixed group of experienced/novice ramblers at an equally uninspiring Dartford station.

Following a short rail journey, we alighted at Cuxton station, an altogether more pleasing structure with its 'old signal box, semaphore signals and traditional level crossing' adjoining the local Medway boatyard.

With views of the motorway bridge to the south and Rochester Castle to the north, our ramble was set to take us from the River Medway to the Thames at Gravesend. However, less than a mile into our journey, a farmer dissuaded us from taking a clearly marked footpath through his land, possibly another instance where local landowners are increasingly denying access to more and more rights of way. We therefore retraced our steps and encircled his land by a longer route through woodland and across ploughed fields. We climbed to Cobham Woods, once an imposing broad leaved woodland but still bearing the ravages of the 1987 hurricane. As part of the once extensive Cobham estate, in the midst of the wood stood an intriguing 18th century building, sadly much vandalised, but originally intended to be used as the Darnley family mausoleum. I subsequently learnt that it was never used for its designed purpose and current plans are for it to be turned into a house!

Eventually finding our way out of the woods, we came to the historic village of Cobham. This was history in more ways than one as both Carole Eastaugh and Carol Russell had lived there in the 1950's and they proceeded to recount how their paths could have crossed in their teenage years. However, it was time for a welcome breather and a pint, in the relative warmth of 'The Ship'

public house.

Suitable refreshed, surprise was shown at the fact that we still had another 5 miles to cover and after a brief pause for a photocall outside 'The Leather Bottle', immortalised in Dickens 'Pickwick Papers', we turned north to cross the A2, close the newly formed Stone Country Park. The decision to route the ramble through this former chalk pit avoided the notorious Thong Lane but with poor waymarking and no landmarks or sun to orientate us, I eventually led everybody astray in a big way, finding ourselves at the rear of 'The Inn of the Lake', some 400 yards from the point where we had crossed the A2 an hour or so earlier! What embarrassment, but it wouldn't have been a proper ramble if we hadn't got ourselves lost!. Having retraced our steps, we found the correct footpath and soon found ourselves on the road to Higham with views across Shorne marshes to the River Thames.

The ramble concluded in the streets of Gravesend - not quite how I had planned it, but it was still daylight and our short train journey back to Dartford was on cue.

Ramble No. 39 will surely go down as a particularly memorable one.

It occurred to the committee that many of you, especially those unable to attend the A.G.M. might benefit from an informal guide to the 1992 Accounts circulated recently. If so, read on....

The Social Section made an excess of income over expenditure during the year of £2,500 which equates to our performance in

1991. Proceeds from raffles held steady as did those from events, such as the Barn Dance, Presentation Disco, Valentine Disco and New Year's Eve Disco. Thankyou to all those people who help on the raffle tables, provide prizes, sell tickets both at poolside and at discos and many thanks to 'Powerful Pierre' who donates his disco services free on every occasion, contributing highly towards their financial success.

There was also a notable increase in the proceeds from the hire of horse and table cloth stalls and we would like to thank Mick Thackray, Dave Lawrence and Arthur Peile for their hard work. The increased income from the sale of crisps, drinks and sweets has been a bonus this year, so again, thankyou to all the ladies who work so hard there and to all of you who purchase.

Another valuable source of income during 1992 was from the sale of photos and we'd like to thank Ian Bulmer for his time and effort in this field, providing us with welcome memories for the future.

Expenditure on coaches was approximately £1,000 less than in 1991 and Peter Frost who organizes this services hope to maintain this saving in 1993. Thanks Pete.

Our main item of expenditure in 1992 was on the purchase of a computer to run the accounts for the club and to provide Desk Top publishing facilities for all our forms and artwork. We should reap the benefits of this 1993, both financially and in time saved.

The net worth of the Social Section at 31st December was £12,000 In the light of the continued recession we are hoping to pass on to our members the benefits of our past success and our aim is to break - even in 1993 whilst maintaining our social atmosphere at the same level. Certain charges will be reviewed and raffles reduced in number to ease the burden on your pockets!

We are very grateful for your support in 1992 and would appreciate your continued help in the coming year. If you have any suggestions you feel we should consider, or can provide help in any way, we'd love to hear from you. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE - HON TREASURER'S REPORT 1992

We have had a good year financially despite the pool hire increase of £1,000 created by increases at both Riverside and Dartford College. A slight increase is again expected during 1993 but we have decided to keep yearly subscription's at the same level despite this. The amount of subscriptions collected has increased by 4% and door money by 17% creating an extra £2,000 overall.

This was achieved by the increase in membership.

The bank interest figure has dropped substantially due to the low interest rates over the year as well as the introduction of bank charges by our bank, who previously ran club accounts without charges.

When studying your Income and Expenditure Account you will notice some dashes appear under some 1991 items. These items were not easily identifiable on last year's accounts which were not computerised and therefore a comparison was not possible.

An increase in Trophies and Medals of £250 is due mainly to the recognition of more swimmers not only in the various leagues we swim, but also by awarding trophies to the swimmers gaining the most points in each age group in the Sprint Trophy and Points Cup series. Presentations were also increased due mainly to the exchange of visits to and from Holland during the year. Computer equipment was bought which totalled £1,000 but this was offset by a grant from Bexley Borough of £500. A depreciation policy has been agreed based on Residual Value of all items over £250 and a register is being set up of such assets.

The Balance Sheet which has now been audited has a net worth of £16,000 with £5,000 worth of stock, £8,000 on the Reserve Account and £1,500 balance on Current Account.

My thanks go once again to Lin Willcocks especially this year for sharing the ever increasing workload on the financial aspects of the Club and also to Don Murray and Dave Lawrence who took on the tasks of auditing our accounts.
