RAMBLE REPORT
THURSDAY 17TH FEBRUARY

We set off at a time when most people thought they should still be in bed! We went to Dartford Station, where we caught a train to Gravesend.

From there we walked through the shopping complex to the Tilbury Ferry. After a long wait, we got on the ferry and crossed the Thames to Tilbury.
