However, the day was capped by Paul Nicholls who won the boys U/15 title receiving a attractive trophy for his efforts.

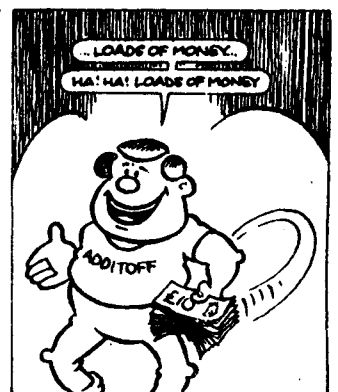
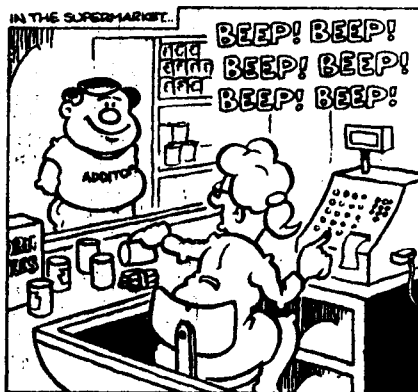
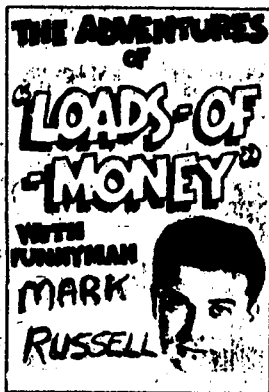

MASTERS CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

This is an attempt to tell the parents of the younger swimmers how the masters events are run and how we arrive at the winners.

In most open competitions, the swimmers are grouped in age bands. A = 25-29 yrs, B = 30-34 yrs, C = 35-49 yrs, etc.. up to M = 80+ and in some cases older! I have personally been at events where there have been swimmers over 90 years old. In one case there was a chap of 94, who had only taken up the sport at the rather young age of 92.

In our club competitions, we have made our age bandings in ten year spans, Group 1 = 25-34, 2 = 35-44 and 3 = 45 and older.

When you enter an event, you submit a time and from this heats are made up, to enable swimmers of the same ability swim together. This can mean that an older swimmer who is very fast may be swimming against younger swimmers in the same heat. This form of competition benefits both the swimmer, who can have a true race and the organisers who may have limited pool time. At the end of the heats, the results are worked out and the winners are declared on time. This is known as heat declared winners.

For the annual gala this year, the masters will not be competing on finals night. At the end of the heats on Sunday 16th October, all the masters swimmers were presented with their medals and the overall best male and female swimmers were presented with their new trophies.
