With the start of another year and for the benefit of newer swimmers and parents, please refer to the list below which summarises the age banding used by this club.

The standard Amateur Swimming Association definition is the age of any swimmer will have attained by 31st December of any given year. This means that from the 1st January 1995, a swimmer born in 1984 will be regarded as an 11 year old. This obviously differs from school age groups which tends to divide age groups as most competitions we participate in base age groupings at 31/12, but the Speedo League favours 1st October. All very confusing!

ASA law also dictates that swimmers of 8 years and under cannot compete in competitions outside of their own club's internal arrangements whilst 9 year olds can only swim in relay races.

OUTSTANDING FEES

With the end of the clubs financial year at the end of February, we would ask everyone to ensure that all club fees relating to the subscription year 1/3/94 to 28/2/95 are paid in full.

M11 LEAGUE

With effect from this season, the league will be known as "The Speedo Junior M11 League". This is in recognition of the status of the national competition this regional league forms a small part of, as there are numerous junior leagues throughout the country.

Swimmers born between 1986 and 1983 are eligible for this years competition. It is essential that all our younger swimmers take part in the Points Cup and Sprint Trophy races, to enable us to select the strongest team.

A number of strong clubs take part in the M11 and we hope to make the top six final again this year.

Because of major changes in the Speedo league set up for 1995, the situation is not yet clear. There are many different areas of Speedo league and from this year, they must all swim on the same dates in October, November and December, not as they do at the moment, which in some cases is February, March and April.

In this area there are two leagues, Southern area (in which we swim) and the London League. Many teams swim in both leagues because they are at different times of the year, but this year they can only swim in one. There are eighteen clubs who swim in both, so, the leagues will be short of teams next year. There is a possibility of the two leagues amalgamating and forming a super league of five divisions, but nothing has been decided. This is our most important competition and I can only hope that is resolved quickly and sensibly.

When I have more information, I will let you know, but in the meantime, if you have a question on any aspect of the club please speak to me. This applies to everybody from Parents to younger swimmers, we will be too pleased to speak. One thing I do ask is that if you are a parent, please tell me who are your children, although I know most of the swimmers, I don't know all of the parents.

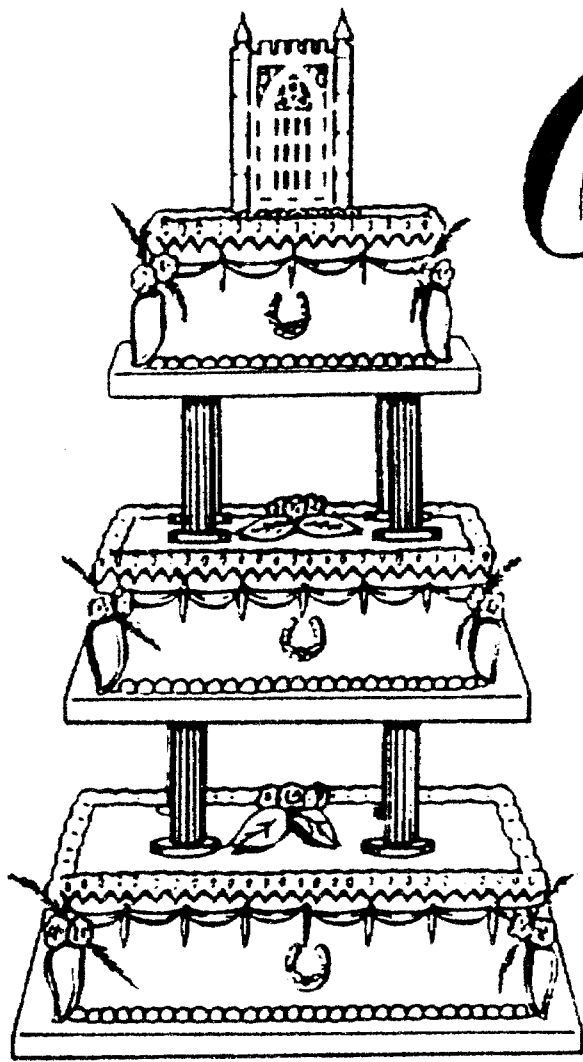

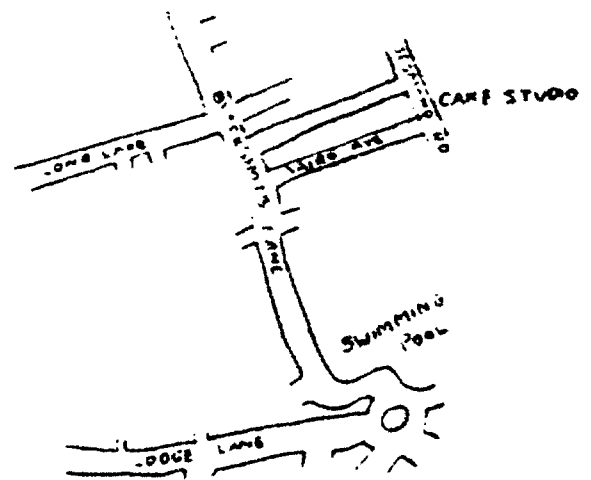
