Erith set for German Festival

Thirty two members of Erith Swimming Club and nine officials will be travelling to Bexley's twin town Neihem Husten on June 2 to compete in the German town's 24th International Swimming Festival.

Spread over three days, the event will be held in a 50 metre open air pool in the heart of the Black Forest.

They will be competing in over 120 events against the best teams in Europe including clubs from Germany, Holland, France, Sweden, Belgium, Hungary, Romania and Denmark.

This will be Erith's third visit to Neihem Husten and they have high hopes of success following a recent improvement in performances aided by additional training at Crystal Palace.

At a civic reception, the mayor of the host town is to be presented with a commemorative glass bowl by the chairman of Erith & District swimming club.

The club wishes to thank parents and friends for organising numerous social events to raise funds for this event and also, the club's trip to Amsterdam during October.

Swimming Festival

More than 30 swimmers from Erith & District SC are currently lapping it up in Bexley's twin town of Neiheim Husten.

But its not all relaxation as the team is competing in the 24th international swimming festival. The event is spread over three days in a 50m open air pool set in the heart of the Black Forest.

The 32 Erith swimmers are competing in over 120 events against some of the best teams in Europe, including clubs from Germany, Holland, France, Sweden, Belgium, Hungary, Romania and Demmark.

This is Erith's third visit to Neiheim Husten, with past years having brought great success, measured by an abundance of medals and certificates.

Bates to swim for Great Britain

Thirteen-year-old Andrew Bates from Erith and District Swimming Club is set to fly the flag for Great Britain when he travels to Germany for a gala in June.

On Saturday Andrew of Cartmel Road, Bexleyheath excelled at the Southern Counties Championship at Crystal Palace.

He achieved third place with a personal best time of 28.27s in the 50m freestyle and fifth place in the 50m butterfly with a personal best time of 31,56s.

As if this wasn't enough, after a long day at Crystal Palace, Andrew then went onto the Walnuts Centre, Orpington to swim for his club.

The teenager managed an impressive first in both of his individual races in the White Horse League Gala.

GERMANY 1995 POST - TRIP REPORTS

Erith make their mark in twin town

Erith and District Swimming Club completed a successful weekend in the 24th International Swimming Festival in Bexley's twin town of Neiheim Husten.

The 32 swimmers began well, Nicky Brandsletter (aged 10) winning silver medals in the 200 metres freestyle and 100m breaststroke during the morning session.

Lee Scott (11) won a bronze, while Paul Nicholls (15) and brother Mark (11) were fourth and fifth respectively in their age groups of the 100m breaststroke.

Andrew Bates (13) just missed out on a medal, coming fourth in the 200m freestyle. In the girls' events, Danielle Poore finished fourth, Sarah Hubbard fifth and Natalie Walker sixth in the 200m backstroke.

At the end of the first session, Erith won two silver medals in the boys' junior medley relay team with Andrew Bates, Lee Scott, Darren Chappell and Chris Partlett and the girls' junior medley team with Kelly Dudley, Leanne Peile, Laura Belcher and Gemma Ford.

The first of Erith's gold medals came after lunch, Nicky Brandsetter winning the 10 years 100m freestyle.

Bronze medals were won by Lee Scott and Andrew Bates with Darren Chappell missing out with a fourth place.

The following day, Darren Chappell, Peter Gravell and Andrew Bates all won silver medals in the butterfly, with Paul Nicholls and Tony Lawrence coming fourth and fifth respectively.

Against strong opposition, Heidi Green (17) won a bronze medal in the 200m breaststroke and Laura Belcher took a bronze in the 100m backstroke.

There were also top six places for Kelly Dudley (12), Gemma Ford (13), Danielle Poore (15), Natalie Walker (15) and Lisa Finch (19).

Nicky Brandsetter won the second of his gold medals in the boys' 100m backstroke, Lee Scott a silver and Darren Chappell a bronze.

In the final events of the weekend, Nicky Brandsetter won his third gold medal in the 4 x 50m individual medley.

Silver medals were won by the boys' junior freestyle team of Darren Chappell, Peter Gravell, Andrew Bates and Lee Scott and the girls' quartet of Kelly Dudley, Claire Greenaway, Gemma Ford and Laura Belcher.

A final medal haul of three golds, eleven silvers and five bronzes gave Erith a final standing of seventh in the overall team competition.

German trip was a splashing success for swimming club

Erith and District SC returned from the 24th international swimming festival in Bexley's German twin town, Neihem Husten, still dripping with success.

Thirty swimmers competed beginning in an open air 50m pool set in the luxurious setting of the Black Forest.

In the very first session Nicky Brandsetter, ten, won a silver medal in the 200m freestyle, Andrew Bates won fourth place in the 13 age group.

Nicky Brandsetter got silver in the 10 years 100m breaststroke, followed by Lee Scott, 11, with a bronze.

Paul Nicholls, 15, and his brother Mark, 11, arrived home fourth and fifth respectively in their age groups and it then fell to the girls to achieve success for the team with Danielle Poore, fourth, Sarah Hubbard, fifth and Natalie Walker sixth in the 200m backstroke event.

Two silvers were won by the boys junior medley relay event.

After the lunch and a parade involving 46 clubs from nine countries the English club took their first gold: Nicky Brandsetter won the 100m freestyle where bronze medals were also won by Lee Scott and Andrew Bates.

Erith was less fortunate in the following day's girls 100m butterfly. But the boys compensated in their equivalent event with two silvers.

In the 200m breaststroke Heidi Green, 17, won a bronze.

In the 100m backstroke Laura Belcher won a bronze and Erith gained a further top six places.

Hero-of-the-event Nicky Brandsetter took a second gold in the boys 100m backstroke followed into second and third places by Lee Scott and Darren Chappell.

The final events of the weekend brought more success for Nicky Brandsetter who took his third gold in the 4x50m individual medley. This brought Erith's medal haul to a

total of three golds, eleven silvers and five bronzes and gave the club the position of seventh overall.

Faversham - 15th July - Gala

We ended the season with a resounding win in a B Grade gala at Faversham.

The competition gave us the chance to put out a team who do not normally get regular gala swims.

Wins were recorded in 28 of the 57 events at the sprint gala apart from the squadron relay.
