MASTERS SECTION

EUROPEAN MASTERS SWIMMING AND DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS PRAGUE - SEPTEMBER 3 - 7 1997

The venue for these Championships was one of the most beautiful and historic cities in Europe. The pool complex, although run down was better than many, if not all of the facilities that this country can offer. It was within easy reach of the city centre by using the excellent public transport system. The Championships opened with a ceremony and a spectacular display comprising of fountains, lights and music.

The swimming began the next morning. All the swimming events were held in the 50M outdoor pool and the diving events were held in the 50M indoor pool. We warmed up in a 33M, 8 lane diving pit. Both inside and outside there was a full compliment of diving boards. Where in this country could you find similar facilities?

There were 3,000 competitors swimming 10,000 events. The Germans and French were well represented and the British competitors numbered about 250. I can't call it a 'British Team' because unfortunately nobody had organised or co-ordinated the

entries. We had definitely been upstaged by our diving counterparts who were a team having organised accommodation and kit.

The organisation on poolside was good, although behind the scenes there was a lack of communication. Races ran to schedule and in some cases earlier. This meant that on one day my husband missed my race and on the last day I swam a 4 x 50M Individual Medley at 8 am after spending the previous evening at a party organised by the divers.

I thoroughly enjoyed my visit to Prague and gained 4 silver medals and a gold in the 50M Breaststroke. I broke two British records in the 50M Freestyle and 50M Butterfly. The next European Masters Championship will be held in Innsbruck in 1999.

30 OCTOBER 1997

Fact can be stranger than fiction.....

Whilst this Ramble was to be billed as 'A walk in the footsteps of William the Conqueror', it was only during arrangements that I discovered East Sussex County Council has been preparing to launch an official '1066 Walk' from Pevensey to Rye.

As this conveniently followed much of the 12 miles we were due to cover, our group of 39 Mums, Dads, swimmers and friends unwittingly became amongst the very first people to use this newly waymarked route.

REVISED TRAFFIC FLOW ERITH TOWN

The final stage of the re-organisation of road layouts and direction (or abolition) of traditional traffic flow will be in place by January.

Although the Club protested strongly at the re-opening of the High Street to through traffic, a public consultation exercise came out in favour, although several other suggested layouts were proposed.

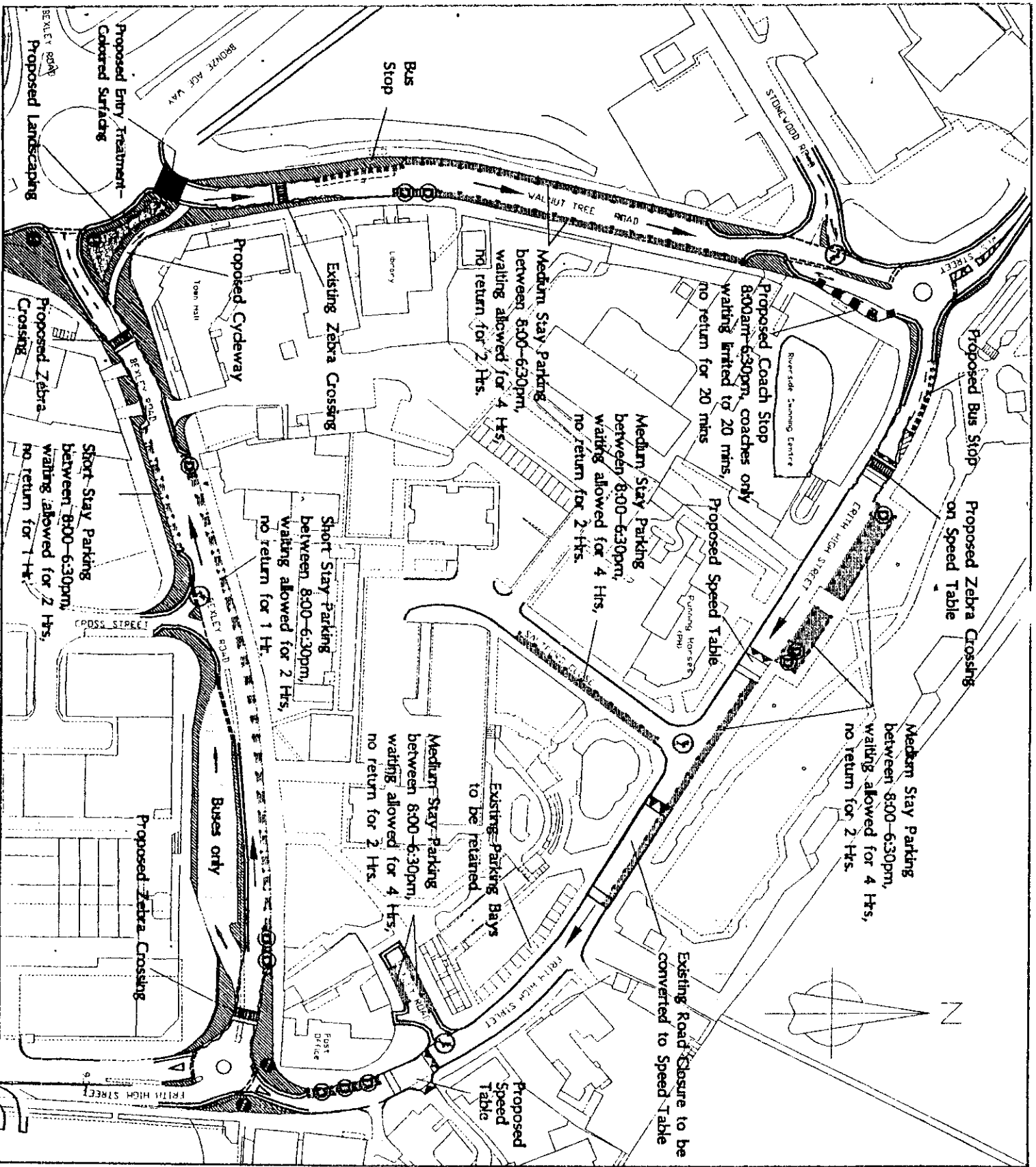
Traffic will be able to reach the pool via Walnut Tree Road but leaving will be past the Police Station to Bexley Road, (see map).





I am told that more parking spaces will be created by allowing parking both sides of Walnut Tree Road and that certain daytime 'No Parking' areas can be used after 6.30 pm (ie during Club time).


To help slow down some of the existing idiots, who currently insist on passing the pool at unnecessary speeds, three calming ramps will be installed.


We hope that swimmers will be extra vigilant during the change over and must remind everyone that we only accept responsibility for members whilst on the pool premises during hire periods. We will obviously take a special interest in these changes and hope that our predications of a further loss of use of the facilities by the general public does not lead to further decline.

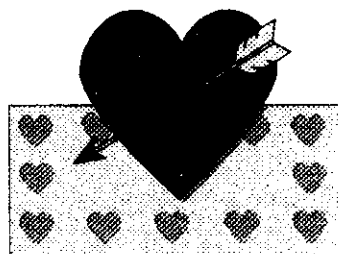
