MASTERS SECTION

NATIONAL MASTERS - SHEFFIELD

23rd-25th October 1998

Twenty-six Erith masters travelled to Sheffield in October '98 to compete at the Ponds Forge pool. Over the weekend there were some impressive performances in the pool, and some serious socialising.

The masters took part in a wide variety of events and unlike many of the larger clubs we entered two teams in many of the team events.

After an entertaining train journey to Sheffield, the competition started well for Erith on Friday evening with a P.B for Freda Ross and Claire Ross in the 100m Butterfly, gaining bronze and silver medals respectively. Mum to be, Jenny Newton swam the 400m freestyle, and Claire Sweeney the 200m breaststroke, both swimming well.

Following a good night out most people managed to get to the pool for the morning session. Luciana Cowell just missed out on a medal in the 100m breaststroke, but Alison Nye got a silver.

The men's 100m breaststroke was an interesting spectacle with Chris Spence and Shaun Smith in the same heat. There was a faulty start, which not all the swimmers heard. The officials were eventually persuaded to restart the event after a 5-minute break and the competition continued without further delay. When eventually Tim Wilkes swam he just missed out on a medal.

The ladies 50m butterfly saw some of our youngsters swimming against some tough competition, and Mark Russell and Richard Wilding only just missed out on the medals. Trevor Holmes and Dennis Vick swam well, unfortunately due to an injury Trevor was unable to compete in any more events.

Less people arrived at Ponds Forge early for the Sunday morning session in which Claire Sweeney had an excellent swim to take a gold medal.

Tim Wilkes swam well in the 50m breaststroke and so did Luciana Cowell in the women's event to get a bronze medal.

The 4x50m men's freestyle team 110-119 yrs got a bronze medal and the women's 120-159 yrs 4x50m freestyle team won gold, with all four swimmers swimming faster than they ever had done before.

The competition in the 50m freestyle was hot, with many Erith swimmers setting personal best times and Alison Nye set a new British record in her age group.

The teams performed well in the last session of these championships with bronze medals for the men's 120-159 yrs and 110-119 yrs medley teams. The ladies took silver medals in the 120-159 yrs medley team.

Everybody who went to Sheffield enjoyed themselves with the majority of swimmers setting personal best times and the number of medals won was awesome.

ANNUAL GALA FAMILY RELAY
