COACHING REPORT - NO.4

Ahhh! At long last summer is here and we are able to wind down for just a few weeks. I would like to take this opportunity to reiterate what Pam has said, and remember that holidays are times when you are relaxed and not tired from school or work, therefore times when you are able to get some good training sessions in.

It was a very busy end to the season, here are a few highlights:

TUDOR LEAGUE: Congratulations to both teams on their excellent performance over the year, especially to the Red Team on bringing home the silverware.

WHITE HORSE LEAGUE: Round 4 at the start of July, saw us pull ourselves back into league winning contention. We are now just 1 league point below White Darts and well placed for the final 2 rounds in September and November.

SOUTHERN COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIPS: I am pleased to say that we sent our biggest team to date to the Championships this year. Despite the general feeling from many people, myself included, that the Championships were poorly ran this year, the competition was made worthwhile by the swims achieved.

As you can now see, Julie Craggs is well into her role as Friendly Competitions Team Manager and has been able to select us some interesting away galas. Please continue to support her when you are selected. It only takes a few crosses on a team sheet and hours of hard work can go to ruin. The team sheets always go up 2-3 weeks in advance, so please check them. If you think that you may be needed for a gala and you know in advance that you are unable to swim, let us know so we can make the correct selections before the team sheet goes on the wall.

Observant spectators and swimmers will now notice that Top Squad are doing a flexibility session before their Tuesday night training. This is something that I hope will soon be spreading through the squads. All swimmers should be doing some stretching exercises to improve their flexibility. If you would like some advice on what to do and how to do it, please come and speak to me or Jenny Newton and we will try to help.

The even more observant among you, will have noticed that a new internal competition has appeared on the Club Calendar, in January 2002. The Champions of the Future competition will be for the younger members of the club only. It will consist of swimmers competing in Year Age bands, i.e. 9 and U/10 and U/11, etc. in 3 strokes, freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke, all in one afternoon. Swimmers will receive points according to their placings in their age groups. The winner in each age group will be the swimmer that scores the highest points. Because this event will be swum in year age breaks, it will give those that are swimming out of age during the year the chance of winning some medals. It will also help enormously with gala selection after the age changes at Christmas.

Do not forget that Club tracksuits are now available by order. I would love to see more swimmers in them. Be proud of your club and wear your club colours.

Congratulations and welcome to Paul Byskup, who has stepped into the role of third coach in our Bronze Squad. Our continuing ability to produce good competitors from this group of young children never ceases to amaze me. The addition of a third set of eyes and some new ideas will only continue to help these swimmers in what is such a vitally important age.

You will also see a group of newly qualified "Club Helpers" on poolside during our early teaching sessions. These swimmers are now on their first steps on the teaching and coaching rung. Clearly these helpers may be a bit unsure from time to time, but, this is to be expected and they will gain more and more confidence as time goes by. They will be the future of Erith and District, and who knows there may even be a future Club Coach amongst them.

I must say a huge THANK YOU, to the parent who has been helping us recently, by putting out the ropes, flags and blocks. I have not met you yet as I arrive at the pool after you have gone. Let this parent be an example to all of you. Remember that the coaches and teachers are on the poolside to coach and teach, so any assistance we receive with equipment is greatly appreciated. Our time is better spent working with the swimmers. If you can help in any way, no matter how small, please come and speak to either Pam Bedford or me at any training session.

There is plenty more I could write about, but, I'm sure you would like to read some of the other contributions to the Newsletter, so, I'll wish you all an excellent summer holiday if you are going away. Enjoy your break and make the most of it as there will be a busy few months coming up.

In a departure from our usual format, Session 2 was extended to 3 hours with the extra pool time allowing Suki and Andy to exercise their coaching skills to the full working with our older swimmers and Masters to improve their racecraft and refine starts and turns.

Whilst I extend a thank you to those swimmers and Parents present, it was clearly evident that this was all but a small percentage of the Club Membership. As a club event that was free, designed to benefit everyone and advertised accordingly, this was hugely disappointing, especially when there was a 90% turn-out for classes the following Tuesday evening.
