



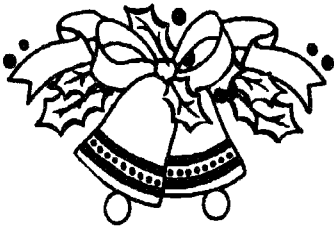

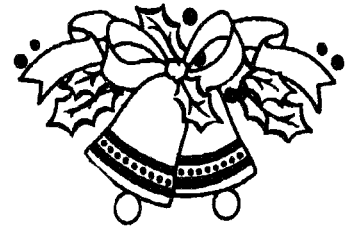

COACHING REPORT NO.5

Once again the last few months of the year have been the most hectic and it's not until you sit down to write these reports that you remember exactly how much has been done. Well done and thank you to all who have been involved, no matter how small your contribution.

In competition our A team have had a very successful end to their year finishing runners up in some strong competition in the White Horse League and gaining a top 6 place in the Speedo League South Division 1 East. Our two Tudor teams continue to swim well on a regular basis. This competition is still very important to us enabling many of our swimmers to gain competition experience. It would seem that our sensible stance in the Octopus League this year saw us come in the lower half of the league, but gave many swimmers the opportunity to compete who do not normally get the chance to. This is and will always be the aim for us in this league. Friendly galas are still very hard to come by, please remember to give Julie as much support as possible when these team sheets go up on the notice board.

It has been very pleasing to see over the last few months that increasing numbers of swimmers have been wearing and competing in correct Club wear. We were without a doubt the smartest team on poolside at the last round of Speedo. This is something we must continue to work at next year as we all want you to be proud to swim for EDSC. Wearing and competing in Club colours will make you feel part of the team and feel proud to swim for your Club. Remember the Club shop is open every Tuesday evening and you can speak to Jenny at any training session.

All training sessions have been very well attended over recent months. One reminder though, that there is a session open to all members from 7-8am on Saturday mornings. Lighter numbers at this session give us the chance to look at swimmers' individual problems more closely. Please feel free to come and join us.

Next year will see some big changes to our Club Championships in the spring. For the first time we will be swimming heats and finals in the same afternoon, one stroke per week. There will be plenty of benefits in this new system, most importantly all swimmers will have an equal chance in all events. Other benefits will include less Sundays being affected as there will be no finals nights and every final will see a full pool, as all swimmers will be at the pool for the heats. More information will be sent to you about this event in the New Year.

We have a very busy couple of months coming up, with lots of Club events planned. January will see our new Champions of the Future competition. February will follow with our annual BLDSA 1 hour postal swim. Then come County Championships, Club Championships, Junior Speedo and much more. It was clear that all swimmers really were putting everything into their races whether it was an individual or a single leg on a relay. The noise on pool side (predominantly caused by Erith's supporters and swimmers) was absolutely amazing, and surely played a part in the incredible number of best times swum.

Though we didn't win a race, there were a couple of 2nd places which came courtesy of **Sarah Garrett and Joe Thorogood**. The relays helped to close the gap on the other teams and we ended up just 5 points away from Braintree. Congratulations though must go to **Tiffany Brown** who broke the girls 15/U 100m Backstroke Club Record with a time of 1:13:53, and **Grant Cooper** who broke both the mens 100m fly and freestyle records with a time of 1:01:49 and 56:03 respectively. Also a special mention to **Peter Frost**, who, despite not quite making it into the Speedo team this year, certainly had reserved a massive amount of energy, just for this night, so that he could cheer every race on like he did.
