This year's county championships resulted in: 43 Individual Swims with 19 Personal Bests, 14 Medals and 5 Club Records +40 Team Swims with 15 Personal Bests

We finished 18th in the Boys competition and 21st in the Girls

Congratulations to all our Medallists; James Vick (2nd, 400m IM, 3rd 50m Br & 6th 200m BR) Joseph Leigh (3rd, 50m BR) Rebecca Gravell (6th 50m & 200m BK) Bryonnie Newing (3rd in Age 50m FLY, 4th in the Open competition) Michael Cook (2nd in Age 200m BK & 200m FLY, 5th in the Open competition for both, 6th 200m BR) and Myles Ellis (4th, 50m FLY).

Also qualifying to compete in the individual championships were; Chloe Hobbs, Ashton Middleton, Emily White, Caitlin Colman, Alexandra Bonner, Daniel Bassett, Alan Fordham and Tom Shea.

Our team swimmers also included: Luke Tait, Lewis Pick, Tommy Cowell, George Leigh, Daniel Wesley, Lily Gardner, Emma Coppen, Holly Fryett, Daisie Hutchinson, Olivia Fryett, Emily Simmons, Megan Harris and Jade Hughes.

Our Record Breakers were; Bryonnie Newing (50m FLY - twice in the same day) and Michael Cook (100m IM, 200m FLY, BK & BR).

Despite the success of these individuals however. I believe we must do better next year. My first aim will be to increase the number of individual swims to 100 next year. From that the aim would be to double both the number of personal bests and the number of medals including one county Champion. The aim in the team events will be to make 4 finals and hopefully finish both the boys and girls competition in the top 15.

I traditionally give out 6 awards for the Championships - this year's recipients are:

Top Boy, based on points per race—James Vick Top Girl, based on points per race—Bryonnie Newing

Swim of the Championship (Boy) my personal highlight of the individual championships:

- Daniel Bassett, 50m FREE. Daniel is always exciting to watch race and visually you can see, as I did in this race he gives 100% in competition and he earnt a cracking PB because of it.

Swim of the Championship (Girl) my personal highlight of the individual championships:

- Alexandra Bonner, 50m BR. Alex has been stuck on the same times for over a year now and has been getting down heartened in competition. Despite this she is one of the hardest trainers in the squad and has never stopped competing for the club. Whilst this swim was not a PB it was certainly the best time she has swum in a while and the relief on her face that she is moving forward again was fantastic to see.

Team Player (Boy) someone who solely qualified for the team events but had a significant impact on the team:

- Conor Middleton. Conor has been in a similar situation to Alex however his progress has been hindered largely due to injury. Even whilst he has not been 100% fit he has still continued to train, doing what he can and to a high standard. He only had one swim in the team events but he made it count with nearly a second off his pb. He then had the option of going home but decided to stay on and cheer the girls on in the afternoon.

Team Player (Girl) someone who solely qualified for the team events but had a significant impact on the team:

- Megan Harris. Megan has had the best part of 3 months off swimming due to injury so it was great to see her in her first gala back beat her best time twice in the same day for 50m FREE as well as geeing all the girls on :)
